## What's Up Mr Puna???



Kia ora whanau - Well..... Week 3 was a big week!!!!! I am so proud of how we all got through last week. Everyone stepped up and did what needed to be done. Our GMS Safety Plan proved to be successful and assisted us in identifying close contacts. Thank you for all your hard work during this time.

We are now at Phase 3 of the COVID-19 response. New Zealand's COVID-19 response continues amid much larger numbers of daily cases.

You may well have seen the headlines in the media about the numbers of cases being seen in schools. Please don't be alarmed by this. It is only natural that as cases in our community

increase, they will appear in our school. We have really good systems in place to respond to this and to keep any spread of the virus – should it appear – to a minimum.

You may have seen Dr Jin Russell in the media noting research from New South Wales about their recent Omicron outbreak showing that spread within the school setting is very low (less than 4% of cases at school infected someone else when at school). We have seen that in New Zealand too.

This is why we remain open at Red. It's great for a child's wellbeing and learning to be at school with their friends and school staff, and we have very good systems in place to keep everyone as safe as possible.

Your job remains the same, too: please continue to keep a really close watch of your whānau for anyone with symptoms. If unwell, please stay at home and get advice about getting a COVID-19 test.

With Phase 3 of the Omicron response, the key change is that it is only confirmed cases and their household contacts who need to self-isolate. Everyone else, including those who may have had close contact with the case but aren't in the household, must continue to monitor for any symptoms of COVID-19.

Rapid antigen tests (RATs) are now being used to diagnose COVID-19 as well as PCR tests. This means that you will get an almost immediate test result back if a RAT is used.

If anyone in your family is confirmed as having COVID-19, you and your household must be isolated for 10 days. Please get in touch with us as soon as you can if someone in your household has tested positive for COVID-19.

Transmission of COVID-19 is still most likely to happen in your home – so please keep doing all those good things to keep your whānau safe.

Wash your hands, get lots of fresh air, cover any coughs and sneezes, clean surfaces regularly, and seek advice if anyone is not feeling well. And please wear a mask when you are out and about. There is information online to help your family prepare to isolate if you need to.

The most important advice we can give to keep your whānau safe is to act as if you have COVID-19. More than a third of people who have COVID-19 will not have any symptoms if they have had three doses of the vaccine. Please think about who you visit and what health measures you can put in place to keep everyone as safe as possible.

We will no longer be sending classes home for online learning unless we have a significant number of staff isolating at home and we are unable to maintain health and safety procedures at school. If teachers are required to stay home and isolate, they will be away from school for 10 days.

Finally, we know how hard the impacts on COVID-19 have been for many families in New Zealand. If you know of a family in your community who is struggling, please encourage them to reach out for support for example to access food, medicine, or access financial support: Help is available – COVID-19 Health Hub.

#### Mask

Year 4-6 - Please ensure that your child comes to school with a mask each day.

#### **Athletics**

Unfortunately because of the current restrictions Sport Southland have decided to postpone Southland Athletics until Term 4. We have decided along with most of the other schools around Gore to carry on with our GMS Athletics Day on the 4th March. Unfortunately, like last year, parents/caregivers/spectators will not be able to attend this event. We are currently working through how to hold the event safely and to stay within the rules.

# GMS RED Light Safety Plan Continues

This plan follows the framework as set out by the Ministry of education.

- All Year 4-6 Children must wear masks inside unless they have an approved medical exemption.
- We ask that parents provide their child with a mask but we will have some at school should they forget them.
- No Assemblies unless outside and classes are spaced apart.
- Children to be dropped off and picked up from the gate.
- We will have stagger finishing time to start with to reduce congestion.

- Room 1-5 2.50pm finish and leave at the middle gate and Room 7-9 3pm and leave at the crossing gate.
- No parents in classrooms other than in Room 1-2 and only to settle the child, and we ask that you leave when the child is settled/happy. These parents must wear masks and sign in at the top of the ramp.
- All other parents please drop off and pick up at the gate and maintain 1 metre distance from each other after school.
- Children from 5-11 years are now eligible to get vaccinated.
- If children are sick (with COVID or flu like symptoms) they must stay home and get tested.
- If you or your child gets COVID please notify GMS as soon as possible and isolate for 10 days.
- Online distance learning will be made available if children or classes are required to stay home.
- Please make sure you have access to Seesaw via your classroom teacher.
- Our focus is still very much on education and progress of learning, if you need to talk with your classroom teacher please do so by email, phone or ask for an appointment after 3.15pm.

Please follow all of the points stated above. If you have any questions or concerns about the current situation please direct them to <a href="mailto:principal@goremain.school.nz">principal@goremain.school.nz</a> and let the teachers focus on teaching.
